Gweithiodd y plant gyda'r tiwtor animeiddio Sean Harris a'r addysgwr cerddorol Dylan Adams i ddysgu sut i greu ffilm 'stop motion' a sut i recordio a golygu trac sain. Ar Dydd Sul roedd yna ymweliad i gastell y Fflint, lle cafodd y plant eu hysbrydoli gan un o dirnodau enwocaf y sir.

*Shrek, Avatar, How to Train Your Dragon ...* Animation has never been more popular! Now, thanks to Menter Iaith Sir y Fflint, the Urdd and Cadw's Lifelong Learning Programme, a group of youngsters from Flintshire will have the opportunity to become animators and make their very own film!  
On April the 17th and 18th local children took part in bilingual 'Songs From Stones' animation training workshops. Animation tutor Sean Harris and music educator Dylan Adams taught children how to use the sound and animation software to create stop-motion films and record and edit soundtracks. On the Sunday there was a visit to Flint castle, where the children drew inspiration from one of Flintshire's most famous landmarks.

Menter Iaith's Language and Heritage Officer Rebecca Davies said, "Everybody involved in the workshops learned new skills and had lots of fun. The weekend was a great starting point for our animation group. There's going to be a lot of work involved designing the art work, storyboarding, animating, recording music and editing, but making the film will be a really exciting process!"  
She added, "We're really pleased that Cadw allowed us to take part in the

The group has been organised by Menter Iaith Sir y Fflint, as part of their Language and Heritage project with the aid of the Rural Development Plan for Wales 2007-2013 which is funded by the Welsh Assembly Government and the European Agricultural Fund for Rural Development. It will meet up regularly to continue working on their project, and the finished film will be shown at a premier at Theatr Twm o'r Nant, Denbigh, in July.
